PRIZE GIVING 2011

Young Children

Dress

For girls this means kilt, long sleeved shirt, tie, but no jersey.

For boys this means long sleeved shirt, tie but no jersey.

The jersey is part of our formal uniform but it is impractical to wear it on this occasion. Please check that shoes are clean, shirts and trousers pressed, and shirt sleeves are down.

Year 12/13 students - Formal dress uniform.

Students Assemble

Students are to assemble in the gymnasium at 6.30pm, where their dress and appearance will be checked. Students who are not dressed to the required standard will not be able to go on stage to be presented formally with their prize.

Prizes Not Publicly Presented

Where students do not attend the prize giving, their prize will not be read out or presented at the function. Their prize will be published in our school magazine and the newspaper, and posted to the recipient.

No School on Thursday Afternoon

To take the place of attendance at prize giving, there will be no school on the afternoon of Thursday 8th December. Students may go home at lunchtime. We will supervise students at school if they are unable to go home.

Prize Giving Compulsory

Attendance at prize giving is compulsory for all students, and students who do not attend will be regarded as being truant. "Don't Share Spit"

Meningococcal Disease – Prevention

Meningococcal disease is spread in a similar way to the common cold. The bacteria live in the back of the throat and nose and are spread by coughing, sneezing, kissing, and sharing food and drink with an infected person. The bacteria hardly ever cause disease. They

mostly sit harmlessly in the throat.

To prevent spreading bacteria, don't share:

- Drink bottles (name your bottle so it is easily identified)
- Lipsticks/ Lip Balm
- Food that has been bitten into (break a piece off an untouched area if you really want to share, or cut it up into pieces before anyone eats)
- Spoons and Forks, knives that others have used
- Glasses or cups that others have drunk from

Santa, Sports Programme, and Self-Regulation at Milton Kindergarten

Gym Report



Elbow Exercises.

The bicep and tricep muscles are the large muscle groups that bend and straighten the elbow. The biceps are located on the front of the upper arm and the triceps are located on the back. As noted by the name, two muscles form the biceps while three muscles form the triceps. Exercising these muscle groups not only increases arm strength but also helps everyone, especially older adults perform activities of daily living. Strong arms help to lift up and out of a chair as well as pull on shoes and other clothing items.

Here are a couple of elbow strengthening exercises.

General strengthening

Sit in a straight backed chair with arm rests, put your feet flat on

the floor, place your hands on the arm rests and push up with your arms lifting your bottom slightly off the chair, hold for a count of 6 slowly lower yourself into the chair and relax, repeat this strengthening exercise 10 times.

Isometric elbow flexion

Sit straight up with your hands under a table, try to lift your hands straight upwards, hold this position for 6 seconds, repeat this exercise 10 times.

Supination and pronation

Stand up straight and hold a wash cloth in your hands, pretend to wring it dry for 6 seconds, pause and repeat this 10 times, switch the direction in which your hands are wringing, repeat 10 times.
