The day started with a nervous 4-3 win over Cromwell. The team were slow to settle in this first game but slowly found their rhythm in the second half. The second game against Catlins was the easiest of the day and a 7-1 win result, although the team was still struggling somewhat with structure, something they would definitely need in the last 3 games. The first major test was against Kaikorai Valley, defending champions and many rep players included. Tokomairiro started well scoring first and defending with all they had. They held the lead for the majority of the match, and although they lost out 8-6 in the last 2 minutes, it was a tremendous effort and the best they were to play all day. Next up was South Otago, with their NZ reps leading the way. The first half was poor and they stood back allowing South Otago to score 3 quick tries, before coming back with a try of their own before half time. The second half was all Toko as they clawed back the lead and finally broke through the desperate South Otago defence for a deserved 4 all draw right on full time. The draw left the team elated and with one more game to go against Taieri, the team had a real chance to get second. The Taieri game was close in the first half before Toko comfortably pulled away for a 5-2 win. In the last round of games, South Otago upset Kaikorai Valley to win overall with Toko third place.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Student Leadership

The focus this year is on students taking on leadership roles and making our school a place where students feel valued, students feel heard and listened to, and a place where we all enjoy being. I have been so impressed with the senior students who are always volunteering to help teachers and fellow students. Three more of our groups of Prefect Leaders introduced their student committees in assembly this week – Learning Support Committee, Media & Promotions Committee and the Sports Committee. Their committee meetings will start over the next week or two and students from all levels of the school are encouraged to find a committee they would like to be part of.

Building community

Our theme of "building community" continued at assembly this week. Research suggests schools can strengthen students' sense of community by adopting a range of approaches. One of those approaches is to: *Emphasize common purposes and ideals*. Along with academic achievement, schools with a strong sense of community stress the development of qualities essential to good character and citizenship, such as fairness, concern for others, and personal responsibility. Everyone shares an understanding of

the school's values, which then shape daily interactions. These qualities fit very nicely with the values of the Tokomairiro Way – Respect, Responsible, Excellence, Integrity, Fairness.

Student Council

Another area of strength at Tokomairiro High School is the Student Council. Each form class has a representative on the council and they were presented with their badges in assembly on Monday. In the past the Student Council has been responsible for some great initiatives and developments around the school. For example: desire for and establishment of the homework club; school blazers; adventure playground; picnic tables. We value the contribution the Student Council make to our school.

Attendance = School Attendance = Student Success

Student attendance, along with effective teaching, has the greatest influence on student engagement and achievement. Research is increasingly showing that attendance at all ages is incredibly important and is directly

correlated to student success. Prolonged absence from school can also lead to loneliness and make it harder for your child to get along with other children and make friends.

This year we are having a particular focus on attendance and a review of our attendance monitoring. Our goal is that **all** students should have attendance rates of at least 90%. At the end of each term we will celebrate those students who have achieved 100% attendance. 90% attendance means students are missing one day every two weeks. 80% attendance means the student is missing one day per week. We want our students to be at school, to be happy and to be engaged in learning. On the next page you will find 10 tips to help you and your child make going to school easier.

Open Week & Year 7 Parents Evening

Remember to talk to your son or daughter about Open Week. We would love to have you come along to class and enjoy the lessons alongside the students. Have a look at your child's timetable and choose a class or classes. We just ask that you sign in at the office when you first arrive.

During Open Week we are also holding a Year 7 Parent Evening where parents get a chance to meet each other, meet the classroom teachers and other staff who are associated with your child. We will have a barbeque at 6.30pm followed by a meeting in the library 7.00 – 8.00pm. If you have children you need someone to look after, so you can come to the meeting, then bring them along. Some year 13 students are going to run some activities in the school hall for the young ones. Please get your RSVP slips back to the form teachers by Thursday. We are looking forward to meeting with you all.



1. Help them pack their bag the night before.
2. Make sure their uniform is ready especially after the holidays or weekend.
3. Get them to bed at a reasonable time so they have a good night's sleep.
4. Set the alarm clock early enough to allow plenty of time to get ready properly.
5. Make sure they have some breakfast.
6. Remind them to set off for the bus or start walking early enough so they won't be late: punctuality is important.
7. Check to make sure they have everything they need – books, PE gear, lunch, etc.
8. If your child is finding the work too hard speak to the teacher.
9. Talk to your child about what they did at school today – ask them if they asked a good question today.
10. If you or your child are unhappy about the way they are treated by staff or other pupils, make contact with the school.
