Research showed that almost one-fifth of children aged 5-14 years did not regularly eat or drink at home before leaving for school. This programme will run on set mornings starting next term and will give the students a chance to have a great start to the day. Students will receive Anchor Milk and Weetbix and also a chance to catch up with others before the school day starts. It would be great to get some volunteers to help us and make this a long term success for our school. Please contact the school office if you are interested. Watch this space for more information. 

Legacy of Yarns

For the first time in 25 years, Dunedin is staging a major Creative Fibre event, Legacy of Yarns.

Nearly 300 people have registered to attend the national event being held at John McGlashan College from April 24 to 27.

Creative Fibre is the public face of the New Zealand Spinners Weavers and Woolcrafts Society (NZSWWS), which has been holding annual festivals since 1970. Dunedin has hosted the event twice previously, in 1989 and 1981, so it is "a thrill for us to have it here this year", Anne Donovan said.

Although Dunedin is the venue, NZSWWS groups from throughout Otago are doing their best to make what Anne calls "a really stunning programme guaranteed to appeal to all those who have registered".

Members of the public can see some of the best craft from around the country in a free exhibition being mounted at the Dunedin Railway Station between 9am and 5pm on April 24-26, and 9am to noon on Sunday, April 27.

The trades section in John McGlashan's old library will offer displays and sales from about 20 retailers whose wares range from alpaca yarn to natural dyes and spinning wheels and this is an opportunity for non-members to browse and buy. There is a \$10 charge for a day pass.

Vallory Brook said the South Otago group was responsible for the Railway Station exhibition and she promised a line-up of the cream of crafts submitted for inclusion in this major presentation.

Nola Allan, of Milton, is handling registrations. "Numbers have exceeded expectations. In fact, we have almost double the number we anticipated and there is even a group coming from Australia," Mrs Allan said.

Port Chalmers members have organised two tours, one around the Otago Peninsula on Anzac Day afternoon, the other to the Bruce Woollen Mill, in Milton, one of New Zealand's oldest spinning and weaving mills.

"We are keenly looking forward to hosting an extremely successful event and only hope it won't be another 25 years before we again show the rest of the country what Otago can do," Nola said.
