We are now into week eight of the term and it is great to see the students working hard and involved in their learning.

Building Community

In assembly, over the past three weeks, we have discussed three practices which research shows help strengthen students sense of community: *Emphasize common purposes and ideals* (have a shared understanding of the schools values which shape our daily interactions); *Actively cultivate respectful, supportive relationships among students, teachers, and parents*; and *Provide regular opportunities for service and cooperation*.


We are now going on to look at the attitudes, the relationships and the support that is so important in making a community a positive place to be. This week I shared a story about the importance of facing our problems and responding to them positively, refusing to give in to panic, bitterness and self-pity. Rather, we should shake-it-off and take a step up.

YEAR 7 VISION SCREENING

The Vision Hearing technicians from Public Health South will be visiting our school to screen all year seven students for distance vision and colour vision (boys only).

Distance Vision (Amblyopia & Hyperopia)

This determines how well your child is able to see at a distance. It involves reading an eye chart. (Not required if child wears glasses.)

Colour Vision (Boys Only)

This is to detect children with the most common inherited colour vision defects (using the Ishihara colour vision book). (Still available to those wearing glasses.)

If you do not wish your child to be screened, please fill out an opt-out slip, which is available at the school office.

Stuck in a Dispute

Ten Tips for Complaining Effectively

1. Know your rights in this situation? Find out before you go back.
2. Complain to the person you first dealt with – This may resolve the problem without having to take it further.
3. Don't delay – Act now before you forget the important stuff. Sometimes there is a time limit for making a complaint.
4. Be reasonable – When you are asking for something to be put right, make sure what you're asking for is fair.
5. Use evidence – Take any evidence related to your complaint e.g. receipts, letters.
6. Prepare – Practice what you are going to say. Consider bringing someone along to support you.
7. Keep cool – Keep calm and remember your manners – this will get you further than if you don't.
8. Escalate – If talking to them doesn't help, ask to talk to their manager or supervisor.
9. Make sure they can contact you – if someone is going to follow up your complaint, make sure that they have your contact details, and you have theirs.
10. Writing a formal letter of complaint can help – if talking with them doesn't sort out the problem, putting your complaint in writing can help.
