

Field of Remembrance

The first Field of Remembrance was held in Westminster Abbey in 1928 and this has now grown in New Zealand to remember those that paid the supreme sacrifice for their Country. NZ's Field of Remembrance Trust has launched the White Cross Project as a Nation Wide Commemorative programme acknowledging the 100th anniversary of events of World War One. More than 110,000 New Zealanders served overseas during the conflict – over 55,000 were wounded and 18,500 died.

A National Cross of Remembrance has been established in Te Papa and it is intended that communities throughout New Zealand create their own Fields of Remembrance.

The Milton Bruce RSA is committed to establishing our own Field of Remembrance representing all those named on the memorials in the district – The Cenotaph, Gates at Milburn, Glenledi Monument and Lovell's Flat Memorial. We are endeavouring to collate the information to include the serial number, rank, name, where they are buried and the next of kin.

We have completed about 80% of this and now ask the community for their help to identify the remaining names and details or correct any errors we have made. We will have a display at the Information Centre so those able to assist can leave any further details there and we will continue to update the display. A number of names are duplicated on the different

Monuments. Any further information would be greatly appreciated. It is envisioned that the crosses will be displayed at the Cenotaph or at the Memorials if required on ANZAC Day and centenaries of major battles and events of World War One.

This terms planning about "Challenging Ourselves" is in full swing and we are enjoying celebrating all children's learning as they take part in the journey of challenging themselves. We are linking this
