YEAR 7 VISION SCREENING

The Vision Hearing technicians from Public Health South will be visiting your school to screen all year seven students for distance vision and colour vision (boys only).

Distance Vision (Amblyopia & Hyperopia)

This determines how well your child is able to see at a distance. It involves reading an eye chart. (Not required if child wears glasses.)

Colour Vision (Boys Only)

This is to detect children with the most common inherited colour vision defects (using the Ishihara colour vision book). (Still available to those wearing glasses.)

If you do not wish your child to be screened, please fill out an opt-out slip, which is available at the school office.

Term 1

Touch rugby

With the touch season coming to its conclusion, the Senior touch teams' hard work over the season is coming to fruition. The senior teams have been playing in two competitions this year, at Balclutha and Mosgiel. The senior boys' team have been on fire and concluded the Balclutha competition winning their grade, the senior men's B grade. Next year they will be promoted to the senior men's A grade which is a fantastic accomplishment. Not to be out done, the senior girls also placed in their grade, coming second in the women's B grade. But the highlight of the season for these athletes would have to be the senior mixed team qualifying for the South Island secondary school touch championships. Only two teams qualified from Otago and they will travel to Christchurch to compete against the best from other South Island schools on 28 March. We hope these students continue their good form and relish the opportunity to represent Tokomairiro at the end of the month.

Otago Athletics Championships

On Saturday, seven athletes went through to Dunedin to represent Toko at the Otago Secondary School Champs. They all performed with distinction with two placings in the senior grades.

Linette Tatupu was placed 2nd in the senior girl's javelin, throwing 23.63m. This continues the great run of results that Linette has produced over her High School years. Although a few metres below her best, she is improving with every competition and will defend her Otago/Southland title next weekend in Invercargill.

Terri Thomas also finished 2nd in the Senior Girls Triple jump. It was a very good effort considering it was her second only competition at Triple Jump and her first at the Caledonian.

Also in the top six were Toni Hall in the long jump (6th), and Karta Hewitt (5th) in the high jump.

Two of our top prospects in the sprints unfortunately succumbed to injury. Defending 100 and 200m title holder Matthew Roxburgh had been battling a hip injury all week and could not finish his 100m heat and Justin Perkins won both his 100m and 200m heat before pulling out of the finals with a leg strain. These two promising athletes will go well in the future if they can get some specific sprint training.

Well done to these athletes (plus a very fit Sam Fischli!). Four athletes qualified for the Otago/Southland champs (Linette, Karta, Terri, Toni).

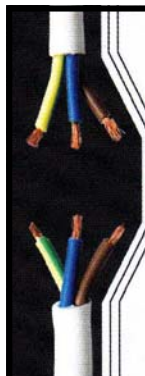
