# Coping with Redundancy

Recently there have been some job losses in Milton. Being made redundant can be a very stressful time and brings with it a lot of financial uncertainty.

Below are some tips that may help. These have been gathered from various sources - listed at the end. For help with your personal budget please contact us and we will arrange for one of our experienced budget advisers to meet with you. Our service is free, confidential and non-judgemental.

## Tips for Coping with Redundancy:

### Examine Your Finances

First you need a comprehensive budget. This will clarify your financial situation and identify any pressure points. There are easy to use budget worksheets online at Sorted and the website of the New Zealand Federation of Family Budgeting Services (details below).

### Take Action

Talk to your creditors now before you fall behind with payments. Explain your situation and ask if there is anything, they can do to help for a short time until you secure new employment.

If you have a mortgage contact your bank to discuss your options.

Cut back on unnecessary expenses, and look at ways to keep your costs down.

### Check your Policies & Contracts

If you have credit contracts or loans, check the policy documents to see if you have a redundancy clause or redundancy insurance which will cover your payments for a time. It doesn't cost a cent to check, and you may get a pleasant surprise.

### Government Help

Contact Work & Income for information on possible entitlements.

Contact Inland Revenue to re-assess your Working for Families payments.

# Text Bullying

If you are getting scary, mean, rude or bullying texts from someone, you can report these messages to your mobile phone company. Your phone company can send a warning message to the bully and even cut them totally off the network.

## TO MAKE A COMPLAINT

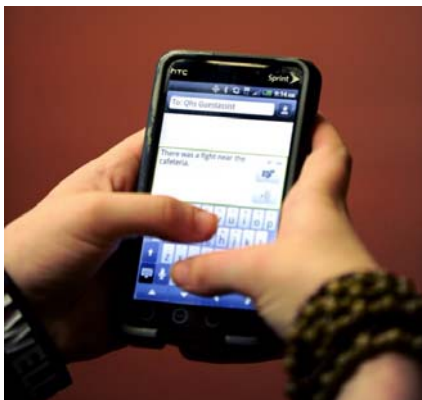
- Don't reply to the messages or contact that number.
- Make a list of the exact date and time you received at least four bullying or harassing messages from that person. To show that the messages are unwanted, the call list can only start from when you stopped replying.
- Call your mobile phone company's customer service centre.
- Vodafone - ph 777, it costs \$1 but you get it refunded if the texts are bullying or harassment type messages. If you have 4 unreplied texts and don't have credit you can text "bully" to 4001 and someone will call you back within two working days. Vodafone have set up a service where people being bullied by TXT can block them with Vodafone's BLACKLIST. It is free and exclusive to Vodafone3. TXT "Blacklist Add (mobile no) to 713 or [www.vodafone.co.nz/blacklist](http://www.vodafone.co.nz/blacklist)
- Telecom - Call 0800 809 806 between 8am and 5pm Monday to Friday.
- Telstra Clear ph 0800 299 500
- 2Degrees ph200 from you cell or 0800 022 022 from you land line.

If the messages are from someone at your school or another school talk to the deputy principal, guidance counsellor or a teacher about how they can help stop the bullying.

If the messages include threats to hurt you physically (like threats to "get you" or "punch you") they are breaking the law. Save the messages on your phone, or at least (photocopy your phone). Show the messages to the police and ask to make a formal complaint about them.

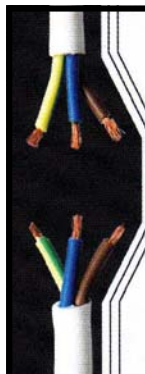
