The session will be presented by talented professional speaker Amy Scott with Clutha District Youth Councillors this time also taking on more of a facilitation role. Nga Whanau O Tokomairiro Inc and Tokomairiro Waiora Inc

What are the differences in these organisations?

Many of the community may or may not know who Nga Whanau O Tokomairiro Inc. and Tokomairiro Waiora Inc. are and exactly what we do. We have been mistakenly thought of as one combined incorporation, due to our names being similar. In fact we are two very different entities, but we do support each other in what we do.

Nga Whanau O Tokomairiro was established in 2003 to support the needs of Maori families within the Tokomairiro district by supporting the development of whanau and community related projects. Our objectives being to facilitate Te Reo Maori me Tikanga Maori (Maori language and practices) within our community. We fundraise, receive and administer funds in the form of subscriptions, koha (donations) and bequests from sources for the benefit of Nga Whanau O Tokomairiro Inc. Some of the projects we have offered in the past include our annual Matariki Celebration, Hangi wananga (workshop), Tuna (Eel) competition, pig hunting competition, afterschool sports activities, Waitangi Day Whanau Day and our recently held Whanau Fun Day on Otago Anniversary Day. We currently support and coach a junior and senior netball team.

Nga Whanau o Tokomairiro Inc. meet on the first Wednesday of every month at the Toko Waiora office at 7.00pm. We welcome new members to come along. For more information contact the Chairperson, Trish Peterson 417 7279.

Tokomairiro Waiora Inc. is funded by the Southern District Health Board and was established in 2007 to provide information and guidance to assist people in our community toward a healthier lifestyle.

Tokomairiro Waiora is a kaupapa Maori Health service but is open to all ethnic groups providing whanau ora services in the South Otago rohe. The key objective of our service is to ensure existing health and social services are co-ordinated to work with Tokomairiro Waiora clients. Our Mission is to support whanau to achieve healthy, safe independent lives by providing a holistic service that uses tikanga to address health and social needs, one on one sessions with whānau to discuss and develop health plans to address needs. A Smoking Practitioner is on board to offer smoking cessation which is a support service that assists smokers to quit.

Information and resources are available at the Tokomairiro Waiora Inc office situated at 80 Union Street.

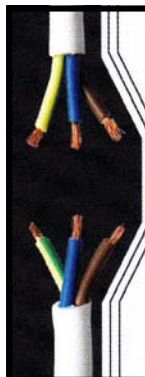
