## Fitness Fundraiser

The heat is on in Waihola this month, fundraising for the Waihola Playground upgrade. With the generosity and support of our able tutor Kate and Waihola District School, the Playground Trustees have organised fitness evenings. Many residents take advantage of the walking and cycling areas around the village in the warmer weather, but this has to be curtailed in the winter months with shorter daylight hours. Participants at these evenings certainly raise their temperatures along with their fitness levels, and get a good cardio workout in a safe and friendly environment. Ages range from teens to 60+. 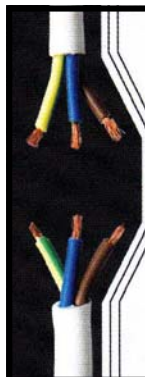
