## South Otago Heritage Society

On Wednesday 25 June, the AGM of the South Otago Heritage Society was held.

The original intention of the society was to display member's own vintage machinery, however it has been widened to encompass heritage display in a broader sense.

Stage two for this display will have a 'man shed', i.e. a place for men and women of all walks of life to go to and use the facilities provided and possibly other people's expertise to work on their own restoration projects. The land being used to build this facility is behind the existing hedge at the show grounds, which the Club will formally lease from the council.

Through growing grain, contract cultivating, raffles and working bees, enough money has been raised to complete the first stage of a substantial shed. Local contractors, farmers and service providers have all given generously of their time and resources to drain, rock the access road, fertilize the ground and generally improve the area. The first shed is on target to be completed within eight months, with the financial assistance of the South Otago Vintage Machinery Club.

The 14 paid up members of the Milton South Otago Heritage Society see that this project will complement Roger Mahen's proposed Tractor Machinery Museum, on the corner of the main road and Helensbrook road.

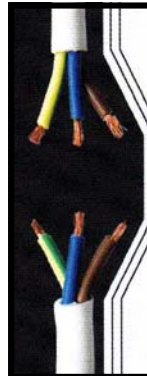
