NZQA FEES

All year 11 – 13 students need to pay their NZQA fees to the school office by **Friday 29th August**. The fee is **\$76.70** unless you qualify for financial assistance.

Financial Assistance

Financial assistance is available to assist with the payment of entry fees for National Secondary Schools qualifications.

- Be receiving a Work and Income or Study Link, benefit (benefit-based applications).
- Have a joint family income that would entitle you to receive a Community Services Card (income-based applications).
- Be a fee-payer with two or more children who are candidates, irrespective of family income (multiple candidate applications), where the total fees you would have to pay would otherwise be more than the \$200 multiple candidate maximum.

You cannot claim financial assistance for international fee-paying students.

How Much Will You Need To Pay?

If you are eligible for beneficiary or income-based assistance:


- One child - \$20
- Two or more children – a maximum of \$30 per family.

Gym Report



Benefits of regular physical activity and exercise.

- * Increased cardiac (heart) and pulmonary (lung) function.
- * Improved ability to perform activities of daily living.
- * Protection against development of chronic diseases.
- * Decreased anxiety and depression.
- * Enhanced feeling of well-being.
- * Weight control.
- * Lower cholesterol and blood pressure.

Kinds of exercises

* Cardiovascular - primarily benefits your heart, circulatory system and lungs.

* Strength and muscle endurance - primarily benefits you by making you stronger and giving you better endurance, so you can do things longer.

* Flexibility - primarily aimed at giving you greater range of motion in joints and more suppleness in your body.

Exercise routine

* Warm up - 5 minutes of light activity, such as slow walking or cycling.

* Activity - cardiovascular, muscle strength or flexibility training.

* Cool down - 5 minutes of light activity with some flexibility exercises built in.

Suggestion for each type of exercise

Cardiovascular - vary your workout session, be creative, and choose a pace that feels good to you. Take slow deep breathes and think tall to maintain good posture.

Strength - Do not hold your breath while strength training. If your goal is to increase your muscular endurance, you should use lighter weights and perform 8 - 12 repetitions.

If your goal is to increase your muscular strength, you should use heavier weights and perform 5 - 8 repetitions.

Flexibility/Functionality

The focus of this workout is to improve range of motion, balance, coordination and ability to carry out regular activities of daily living. Be sure to hold stretches and progress slowly. Every muscle group used in a workout should be thoroughly stretched. Stretching should not be painful.

WW100 Remembrance at Milton

On the 5th August at 11:00 hours, a service was held at the Cenotaph at Milton organised by the Milton Bruce RSA to remember the start of World War 1 and to honour the districts fallen soldiers amongst the Field of Remembrance. The ceremony was watched by a good crowd, including the pupils from St Mary's Primary School. President G Henderson opened the ceremony by laying a wreath at the Cenotaph with the Clutha District Mayor Mr Bryan Cadogan. President G Henderson gave a short address and was followed by the Mayor B Cadogan who expressed his astonishment at the number of crosses displayed in a small community. The last Post was played admirably by G Powell and was followed by the Ode, narrated by G Henderson and then closing the ceremony the National Anthem was sung by Robin Fox with bagpipes by J McIntyre. Members and the public then filed past placing their poppies as a mark of respect for the fallen.

Come along and visit the girls at ANZ and help us support our local region in raising funds for this worthy cause.

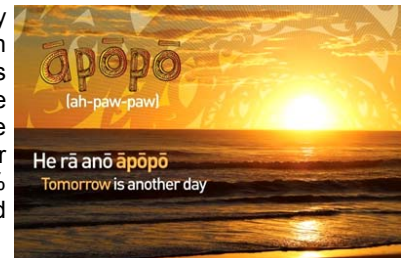
Milton Kindergarten

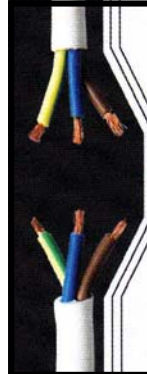

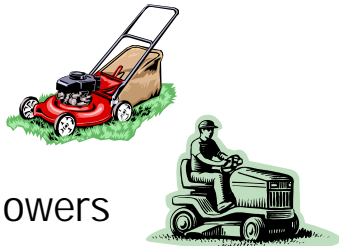

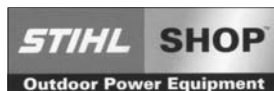
