Otago Museum Stay Over

On Wednesday 20th August, 17 students, Mr Rayner and Mrs Gowing went to the Otago Museum for a stay over. We left school at lunchtime in anticipation of the adventures ahead. The students from the bus were from the ALL programme (Accelerated Literacy Learning), the Senior Drama class and some of the Tech Team. We all had different reasons for going: The ALL programme students were writing about the exhibits;



the Senior Drama students were getting ideas for an assessment and the Tech Team were there for costume and lighting ideas.

After some lunch, we were greeted by our guide for the day, Kim, who took us for a journey through the Ancient Egyptian gallery. A hi-light of this was seeing a real mummy and hearing about the identification process. We were also shown an artist interpretation of what she may have looked like, based on her bone structure.

After having pizza for tea, we took a walk to the Pacific Cultures gallery and given a task to do. This involved creating our own Island culture and garments, which we had to present back to the group.

Later on our guide, Jacob, led us on a night walk through a series of dark rooms to the Animal Attic. We lined up, put our arms on the shoulders of the person in front and moved slowly through the rooms. Although we only went through two rooms, it felt like it took forever. When we got to our destination we were read a story about the different animals and how the sleepovers disrupted their night parties. Unknown to us, Baz and the seniors were hidden around the room and made bellowing noises that scared us out of our skins.


Back at Discovery World we were given a paper thin air bed and ordered to go to sleep, unless we wanted an extra early wake up call. During the night some of the boys played pranks on each other by letting the air out of each other's mattresses.

Winter Sports Week

This is the Secondary Schools' Winter Sports week and our senior netball team is at a South Island tournament in Invercargill. The team is accompanied by Lorraine Tapp and Lisa McElrea, along with two parents. We wish them all the very best for their tournament.

PTA Fundraiser – Annual Trail Ride

This is the major fundraiser for the Parent Teacher Association here at Tokomairiro High School. This year the event will be held on Saturday 1 November. All students are asked to make a donation of food items for the event. A letter was sent home last Friday. We count on the support of our school community to run this event and make it a successful fundraiser for the PTA, who use the money raised to support school activities. Senior Examinations

It is really important that all students plan their study timetable and strive to achieve their very best in these exams. The students will be on study leave when they do not have an exam. Rooms will be available for students to study at school. It is really important they prepare well for these exams and strive to achieve to their very best.

Learning Curve

The learning intention for this week

is to raise student awareness of their progress and ability to cope, and to develop a willingness to seek assistance if they feel that they are falling behind. It is important they develop an understanding of the proactive measures they can take and the support that is available. This week's lesson focuses on dealing with times of stress and the importance of looking for support in those around you. This is a very timely lesson for our students and I encourage parents to take time to discuss these ideas with your children.

Junior Students' Workday – Tuesday 16 September

Tokomairiro High School has a proud tradition of workdays and we love the fact that the community get behind it. The workdays are a major fundraiser for our Student Council and all the funds raised go on student initiatives. Examples of some of these initiatives are: picnic tables around the school; curtains, tables and chairs for the canteen; water filters; Homework Club catering; sporting equipment; student badges; financial support for building and upgrading the playground area. We ask that our junior students (years 7 to 10) find a job for the day. A payment of \$5 per hour for at least 4 hours is expected i.e. at least \$20 is required for the school. HEALTH SNIPPET

Conjunctivitis

Conjunctivitis is a common inflammation of the eye. It is caused by infection, allergies and/or something foreign in the eye, irritating it. The eye affected is usually red, itchy and swollen, with discharge and crusting on the eyelid. It is infectious and needs to be treated with antibiotic ointment or drops. If it is bacterial, symptoms can be helped by using cool compresses, or gently cleaning the discharge from the eye with a clean cloth and warm water. Always wash your hands carefully after contact. A person is contagious while they have discharge from the eye. To prevent it spreading, keep hands away from eyes, wash pillowcases frequently, don't share towels, replace eye cosmetics frequently and follow correct care of contact lenses.

Yarnbombing

The Art of Yarnbombing goes back to the imaginings of Magda Sayeg, from Houston, USA, who bombed a doorknob for her store in 2005. The knitted graffiti, or Yarn Bomb has since taken off in the United States, Europe and beyond. It can be as small as a slim band around a post, or as large a piece as to cover a bus. Now the yarn bomb frenzy has landed in Milton, New Zealand.



A humble crew of four locals, called the Yarn-itlers, so far has taken hold of knitting needle and crochet hook to construct the fuzzy revolution in Milton. They ninja by night, they construct by day. The yarn bombs are meant to provoke smiles, laughter and a moment of wonder. They are deliberately placed in the public domain to enhance lamp posts, fences or power poles. The yarn bomb objet d'art is a temporary adornment that should not be taken seriously under any circumstances.

Milton was deliberately yarn bombed on the first day of spring to celebrate the arriving season, the birth of new life and change in the air. Watch this space. More will be happening in the coming months.

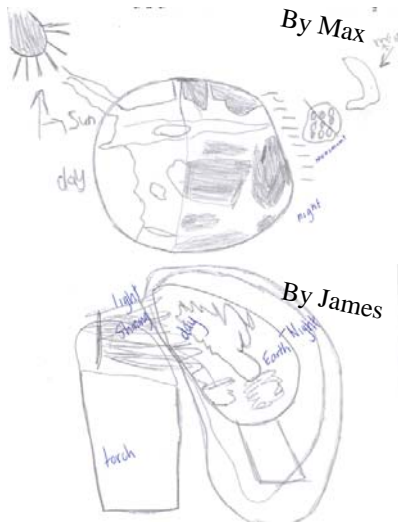

MP3's Recording Studio Visit

On Tuesday 19 of August, the school's band, MP3, visited the University of Otago's recording studio. They recorded four original songs entitled, "I'm Over It", "Friendship", "Before It's Too Late" and "Paradise." In the morning when they arrived, they were shown the main studio where they would be recording. The mixing board where they were recording was worth around \$1 000 000. In the morning the main sound track of the band was made and it only took a couple of takes for each song. In the afternoon we had one more song to complete and then it was just the vocalists who were needed to record the vocal tracks. They did the vocals separately because otherwise the band music might spill over into the vocals. This was the fourth time that the school band has been to the recording studio during the last five years and it has now produced a total of sixteen songs, including thirteen original compositions, some of which were co-written by the children themselves. Although the recording work was completed on the day of our visit, the recordings have not yet been mixed but we are all looking forward to hearing what we hope will be a very professional sounding CD.

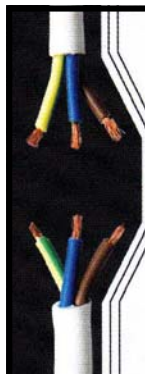
