Lake to Sea Trail Bike Ride

1st November

The Lake to Sea Trail Bike Ride is the annual major fundraiser for the Tokomairiro High School. In its 13th year, with the help of the PTA committee along with community sponsors, including Mclver and Veitch, volunteers, parents and teachers, we are hoping to exceed last year's participation of riders of over 740.

A few new challenges have been included this year to keep the experience rewarding for the seniors. We really appreciate Brian Griffin for the many hours he has provided in developing the ride. This includes up to 140km from Milburn to Toko Mouth and return, through forestry, farms, gravel, mud and beach terrain. This course includes a lunchtime stop at Bull Creek, including a sausage sizzle.

They have also arranged a less challenging course for the less experienced riders that covers approximately 80kms, including a sausage sizzle. The juniors (15 and under) will be led and accompanied throughout the course by experienced riders but we do request that the under 12s are joined by a parent or guardian please.

The safety of the participants is the highest priority for the organisers and all appropriate measures have been taken, including marshals strategically placed along the course with St John members and ambulances available during the day.

Without the enormous generosity of local farmers, land holders and Wenita Forestry, this family event could not be run. Therefore there is a strict policy of **NO SMOKING OR NO ALCOHOL** on the trails, please respect and take care on private property.

There is a compulsory gear list and bikes have to be scrutineered between 7.30am – 9.30am before starting the course.

Entry prices are: Senior \$50, junior \$30 (15 and under), entries on the day incur an extra \$5 charge
Please also note that all entries are provided with a BBQ at the end of the event

Vivienne Galletly, our speaker, is an ex teacher and the Vicar of the Milton-Tuapeka Parish. She told of her life leading to where she is today and described the busy life of a parish priest in a rural community. In addition to her role as vicar where she is committed to pastoral care, leads worship and conducts weddings, funerals and baptisms; she also has involvement in the Food Bank, Budget Advisory Service, Community Youth Worker Trust, Holiday Activities, Christmas boxes (which go to the Pacific Islands) and Nga Whanau O Tokomairiro. We were relieved to hear that she has managed to shed some of these responsibilities, but has taken on new ways to serve – recently a speaker at the National Council of Women on the effects of the Otago Corrections Facility and its effects on the people of Milton. Her brief overview of her talk was fascinating and especially to hear that the worries that were held by that community have not been realised – no negative comments and employment opportunities for those who lost jobs as local factories were closed. In thanking Vivienne, President Carol said she knew she would be a very interesting speaker – how right she proved to be.


