War Veteran Interview

Colin Flett

How old were you when you first went to war? I was 18.

What year did you go to war? I first went to war in 1942.

Did you volunteer or enlist? I volunteered.

Where were you stationed? First Wigram, near Christchurch, for the airforce, then Blenheim and on to England, Egypt, Italy, Greece

What kind of things did you see on the way there? On the travel there, they unfortunately lost a man overboard, due to rough seas across the Pacific.

What kind of regiment were you in? I was in the Territorials before I was 18.

Was it any different to what you imagined? We weren't really told where we were going.

What were the ration packs like? Perfectly good food.

What did you do in your spare time? The long weekends allowed us to go wherever we liked.

Colin was a pilot, he flew Douglas Bostons. He earned nine shillings a day. Colin was a Sergeant Pilot then after six months he became a Flight Sergeant.

In 1945 Colin flew to Australia, then arrived back in New Zealand in early 1946.

We would like to thank Colin for his sacrifice in war and for taking the time to answer these questions for us, as it gave us and hopefully will give the students of Tokomairiro an insight into this man's life at war and to teach us how lucky we are today.

Road Safety

First we got told about a boy who became unable to move his body because his head smashed against the side of the gutter when he wasn't wearing his helmet. We got taught what to do so that didn't happen to us. We tested if our brakes worked, then everyone went around the playground on our bikes. When we went around corners we had to put our arm out and point it the way that we are going and after we did the lap we had to look back at the sign that was being shown to us. After we did that, Constable Greer put out a ramp and that was to help us get our confidence up. At the end we played a game, where you get to the other side going really slow and you weren't allowed to put your feet on the ground. It was fun to have a practical session on our bikes and we learnt some important things to help keep us safe on the roads.

Council Seeks Help to Improve its Forestry Investment Return

Clutha District Council is currently calling for proposals to help it achieve the best returns from its investment in forestry.

We own approximately 464 hectares of land, with 358 hectares occupied by commercial trees. There is currently 100 hectares of mature trees that can be harvested.

Council has signalled that it does not wish to purchase any more land and has invited anyone interested to submit a proposal demonstrating how to generate the highest economic return from our existing forestry resources, including divestment as an option.

Chief Executive Steve Hill said he believed a range of companies, contractors or even other local authorities could submit a proposal and the RFP (Request For Proposal) was not limited to just forestry management companies or contractors.

Council was looking to enter into a contractual relationship with the successful proposer he said.

The final date for proposals was 5pm, 5 June 2015.

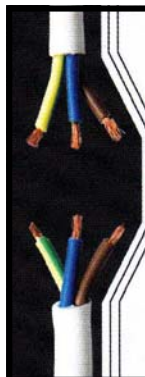
