## Milton Anglican Church 150<sup>th</sup>

Along with the Borough and many other groups, the Milton Anglican Church will mark 150 years in 2016.

The first Anglican service was held in Tokomairiro in about 1858 and the foundation stone of the present Church was laid in January 1866. Although not complete the Church was usable three months later when it was dedicated on 17 April 1866.

On Sunday 17 April 2016 the congregation will celebrate the sesquicentennial of the Church building with a service at 10am, a catered lunch and opportunities to mix and mingle. Although everyone is welcome at the service, registration and payment is required for the lunch.

Instead of a Parish History we are inviting people to record their memories and involvement with the Church and the Parish.

Members were able to put a face to the name in the Genesis! Glenis impressed with her enthusiasm and passion for the school and community. She was bought up in Mosgiel and appreciated the support of a small district. She and her husband did not hesitate to relocate to Milton when she was appointed. She was a teacher at Queens High before becoming Deputy Principal there. Her teaching background is in mathematics and she spoke of her enjoyment seeing students 'click' and her habit of encouraging questions to ensure the students were engaged in their work.

From the start, she has loved her time in Milton and describes the school as a wonderful place with great kids. She believes school education is important until at least 18, unless other work or training opportunities are taken on. Students are actively encouraged to stay at school, to attend regularly and to gain Level 2 NCEA. Discipline is based on a restorative system, teaching pupils to take responsibility for their actions, and with help and support to move on.

The vision for the school is to make it the first choice for local secondary pupils, to cater for all students, using e-learning where needed, to encourage sporting, cultural and pastoral activities with a strong Interhouse system and to build on the music areas.

She left us with a quote, "They won't remember what you said. They won't remember what you did. They will remember how you made them feel". Glenis was thanked by Viv Child and presented with a fruit basket.

The next meeting will be held on Thursday December 3 at 10.30am at the RSA rooms, committee to meet at 9.30am. Remember to bring a plate of finger food for our Christmas lunch and any Christmassy CDs you may have. Lilli has prepared a quiz to test us!

# Chairperson's Annual Report

1<sup>st</sup> July 2014 - 30<sup>th</sup> June 2015

It is with pleasure that I submit the nineteenth annual Chairperson's report of the Milton Community Health Trust (MCHT).

It has been a challenging year in the health sector. The Southern District Health Board (SDHB) is under financial pressure and has enforced that all health providers in the Otago/Southland region take a 5% decrease in their annual contract funding. This means that MCHT will lose 5% of its funding from the SDHB going forward but will be expected to continue to provide the health services in our current contract with them i.e. District Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy and Meals on Wheels. We always endeavor to keep clients at home as long as possible living within a safe environment. With funding reductions it is likely that this will be more difficult.

The MCHT is continuing to support and partly fund the Support and Advocacy service. Very positive feedback about this new service has been reported to the board. The Tokomairiro Community Hub is developing well in the old BNZ building. Thank you to the Milton Rotary Club and Milton Lions Club for their continuing support with donations to the service. We have also received grants and donations from the NZ Federation of Graduated Women (Otago Branch), Community Organisation Grants Scheme, the For Everyone Charitable Foundation and a significant grant from The Trusts Community Foundation towards the Client Support Workers wages. These donations have

allowed the Support and Advocacy work to continue and the community hub to grow.

We have also had numerous donations to the District Nursing service from many families who wish to acknowledge sound nursing care of their loved ones. These donations are appreciated, thank you.

The Milton District is fortunate to have a large group of dedicated volunteers who deliver Meals on Wheels. Voluntary drivers are also available to take clients to hospital appointments etc. The board thanks you all for your time and commitment.

A big thank you to Dale Wyber, the Nurse Manager for managing the MCHT contracts which aid in providing our community with an up to date, quality District Nursing service.

Bruce Vollweiler, Holly McMillan and Dr Wayne Cunningham (Medical Representative) have retired from the board. We thank them for their valuable contribution.

Lastly I would like to thank the current board members Kerry Dowling, Justin Geddes, Chris London, Susan Stewart, Gaynor Hayes and Suzanne Corboy for their continued interest in the running of the MCHT.

It is our job to maintain the current health services, which will enhance community health in these challenging times.


