Assembly Message This Week

The theme of personal excellence was continued. This time the story of Irena Sendler was shared. This is a poignant story of a young Polish mother who worked in the Polish underground during WW2 and who was responsible for the smuggling of 2500 children and babies out of the Jewish ghettos to secure their survival.

The parents of these children mostly died in gas chambers which, without Irena's intervention, would also have been their fate. The story is amazing and the message was that if you know something is right; not to let the chatter of others, or even your own head chatter, sway you away from the correct course. You need to be the very best person you can, always. You may not be applauded for doing the right thing, but you will know in yourself, there really was no other choice. This is a good, honourable way to live.

Muria te pono - Believe in yourself

Further to this, students saw a video, made by their peers, expressing the need for

sensitivity around the issues of videoing others without their knowledge or permission and how nobody really appreciates this. The repeated message here was the invasion of personal space and the risk of safety around the images and data being picked up and used by unknown people. This was a timely and useful message. We hope, in this age of easy access to collecting digital data on others, students realise their need for safe practices.

Tokomairiro Early Learning Centre

March was a very busy month for the Tokomairiro Early Learning Centre, with lots of new and interesting experiences being offered to our children. First up was the four year old sleep over at Spenser Street and thirteen very excited four year old children had the opportunity to have a fish and chip tea at the centre and then spend the night with their friends and teachers. They loved this and it was a fun evening for all involved.

The emergency services have been the focus of our teaching over the past few weeks. We were very fortunate to have Constable Rochelle Gordon visit both our centres to talk to our children about the role the police play in our community and they even got the chance to have their finger prints taken, check out the inside of the police car and listen to the siren going as the lights flashed. We also went on a visit to the local fire station and a big thanks goes to Raymond Burleigh and Lambie Moana for giving up their time during the week to talk to our children and allowing them the opportunity to see inside the fire engine and try out the firefighting equipment. In addition to experiencing something new, opportunities like this benefit our children by providing them with new sights and sounds to talk about with their friends and family and it also helps to familiarise them with the fire and police service, so if they ever come into contact with them in real life, it is less intimidating for them.

We would also like to thank Joyce and Rex Spence, who visited our Spenser Street centre with their piano accordion and guitar for a sing-a-long, which the children absolutely loved. Other experiences include our annual visit to Earthlore (an insect park near Owaka) and the beach at Kaka Point, which was a great day out for our four year old children and their families. We have also held a very successful bike-a-thon at Moore Park on March 18, which raised over \$900 from food and raffle sales and also from the children being sponsored to participate in this. We were very proud of our children who biked round and round the track for a considerable length of time and a big thanks to all their families and whanau who sponsored them. The money raised will be used to purchase new play equipment for both centres.

Holiday Training Programme for Teenagers

"The betterment of the world can be accomplished through pure and goodly deeds"

April 22 until 1 May. Milton and Dunedin are proud to offer a youth training programme these school holidays.

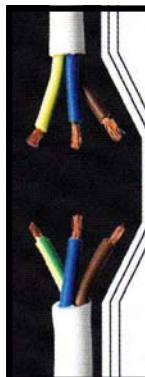
