## FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

#### Week's roundup

The final week of term has now been and gone. The group returning from the Routebourn tramp reported that it was a glorious experience despite driving rain and gale-force winds as they went over the top. We farewelled the Kepler trampers on Thursday who were away for four days. Senior students met with the Otago University Liaison officer along with a visitor informing them about going on to the electoral roll. Our School Wide Positive Behaviour team continue to meet and explore initiatives to encourage positivity in our students in and out of the classroom. On Wednesday, students went into Dunedin to compete with East Otago High school in a series of sport codes. The day was tremendously successful with 18 wins, 8 losses and 2 draws. The years 9, 10 and 11 won all their games. Coaches have reported our students were well-behaved and showed true sportsmanship with their congratulations and commiserations with the opposition. We had our "Principal's Lunch" this week which acknowledged the hard work put in by many of our students over the term and of course, we concluded the term with our final assembly where personal excellence was celebrated through public recognition. This is a rewarding assembly as students are acknowledged and supported for their efforts. We were also able to farewell our Thai students who gave a short recital of traditional Thai singing and dancing.

#### Term's Final Assembly message

This was about creating personal stories, making choices and building relationships. It ended with this little narrative, "I Have a Choice about Today" (author unknown)

And of course, our office staff are the meet and greet people working with students, parents, teachers, businesses and fronting phone calls. They also may wear the regulation blue scarf and plain navy hat (without logos). For added warmth, we suggest they layer up under their uniform. ## Museum / Information Centre Report

ANZAC memorabilia is on display this month in the Museum. Some items include a photograph of Returned Soldiers at the late Mr & Mrs Boyd's homestead at Lovells Flat which we know today as Garvan Homestead. Also a framed and stitched Souvenir of Egypt "To mother with love" from Andy 1941 which is on loan from the Gordon Family.

There has been several requests for research including a family looking for a photograph of John McIntosh of "Bleaton Farm" Sally's Gully off the Toko Mouth Road where they farmed. Their son William was killed in WW1. If you are able to help with this contact the Museum please.

A descendant of the Currie family visited seeking information. This led to a link with William Robert Currie who died of his wounds on 10 October 1918 in France. William was born at Burnside Farm Lovells Flat, 1889 one of 7 children. William married Elizabeth (Leeke) and lived on a small holding at Clarksville bordering the Tokomairiro River and Railway line. He worked for a time shearing sheep with his brother John with portable Wolseley shearing machines, the first in the Tokomairiro District to use them.

William and Elizabeth were blessed with two daughters, Grace in 1916 and Frances being born at the beginning of 1918, sadly never meeting her father. Many families suffered similar experiences leaving the women to manage as best they could in these difficult times.

The Historical Society received at their monthly meeting a copy of Paul Griffin's completed 2nd revised edition of his book "A Chronicle Look at Milton Pottery". A huge amount of work has gone into this book which retails for \$35, being available for purchase at the Information Centre counter. An amazing read and resource of Milton History.
