## Milton Volunteers in Vanuatu

On Friday 15th April five Milton Volunteers set off to Vanuatu to help with a Rotary NZ project. The project was started in October 2015 by the Birkenhead branch of Rotary NZ. Many volunteers from all over New Zealand and some from Australia, have donated their time to help rebuild Mbossing Primary School on the island of Ambrym in Vanuatu. The school was devastated by Cyclone Pam in March 2015. Stage one was completed late last year which entailed the rebuild of the main classroom block and work is currently into Stage Two which is focusing on sorting out the other school buildings as well as making improvements to sanitation. About 120 students go to school at Mbossing from other parts of Ambrym Island so work has also included rebuilding two dormitory buildings which are used for night accommodation as well as buildings for teachers and other school facilities.

Brendon and Suzie Bearman, Peter Mallon, Colin Tiffany, and Ross McDonald all spent



ten days working and experiencing the basics of Island living. They arrived in Port Villa and after a nights stopover in the capital of Vanuatu they were up early and heading to their final destination of Ulei, one of 33 villages on the island of Ambrym. It was Sunday the day they arrived so no work was underway and it made for a relaxing day to get acquainted with the intense heat, humidity and their very basic living conditions.

Island life consisted of waking up to the bells of the church which usually began ringing for morning service at 5.30am so after breakfast it was usually a 7am start to get as much done by lunchtime as possible. Brendon, Colin and Peter spent their days at the building site rebuilding the schoolrooms, reroofing and finishing off what jobs other groups before them had started in preparation for the next group that was to be coming after them, while Ross's skills were being well utilised repairing

and extending the water reticulation in the village, and areas that had not had running water before were finally rewarded. Suzie's roll was campsite liaison and her days were spent making sure that food was arriving, water was being prepared for the men and any information was being passed around. As the heat was well up into the mid to high 30's, and too hot to work in, there was some downtime from lunch till around 3pm when the day becomes cooler and then they would work until 6:30pm when they started losing day light. These downtime periods were used as rehydration times from all the sweating they had done building in the morning, discussing what other projects needed to be done before days end and catching up with the local villages about their island. One of their afternoons was spent at the local school where they were invited to give out prizes to the students. These prizes included dictionaries, stationery, Frisbees and balls that had all been brought over to distribute to the school children and were a great hit. Most evenings consisted of a swim in the sea to cool down (even though the water temp averaged about 28 degrees) and cold shower after to wash off the salt water then tea and cards under lamplight as there was no electricity on the island.

All members were very satisfied with what they had achieved during their short stay on the island and found it to be an experience they are pleased they got to do and will not forget in a long time.

Footnote: There was an article in Saturdays "The Mix" portion of the Otago Daily Times which talks about Ambrym Island and its famous volcanoes.

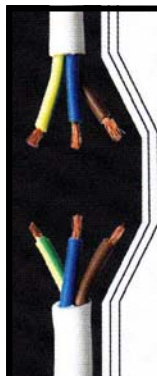
