Hello. Kon ni chi wa. I'm Lisa Ogawa. Ogawa means 'a little river'. I'm from Kanagawa next to Tokyo in Japan. I came to New Zealand on the 29th of January. I will stay in Milton until the 9th of October.

When I arrived in Milton, I was surprised at all the farms, grass and trees; it is so green here. In Japan, I live in a city where there are many people and cars, and it is very busy. It is mostly concrete and there is not much grass.

I go to Tokomairiro High School. I think the Toko students are full of energy and fun. I want to be able to speak English well, as soon as possible.



Hello, Guten Tag. My name is Torben. I'm 14 years old and I come from Germany. I've been here since January and have really enjoyed the time. What I really like in New Zealand is that the people are so nice and friendly, no matter if it's someone in school or just a person on the street you ask for the time or something. Also one thing I really like about New Zealand is nature. New Zealand has so many beautiful places, all the beaches and mountains. Another thing I like is that the school is much easier than the school in Germany and that I have some subjects here that we don't have in Germany. A very good thing about the school and the people is, that it was very easy to find friends and feel comfortable. I think it is because of the small size of the school; everyone knew me before I knew them and came and talked to me. You might wonder if I miss my family and friends over in Germany; it's not that I don't want to see them and spend time with them, but I'm not really homesick because everything here is so nice that you don't really have time to think about what you might miss in Germany. But there are still some things I prefer in Germany, like the transport. It is very much easier in Germany to get around, because you just get into the next train and arrive in another town or also another country if you want. Another thing is that Germany is



much bigger than New Zealand, so you have many more people around you. Everything is closer and easier to reach, but it's still nice to live in a smaller country for a while. I will stay in Milton until August and I know that I will enjoy the rest of my time here.

National Bullying Prevention Week

This week is National Bullying Prevention Week. Bullying is when someone hurts or upsets someone else on purpose, usually more than once. Bullying can happen face-to-face, online or on mobile phones. It can be done in front of other people or when no one else is around. Bullying involves a power imbalance based on things like physical size, age, gender or social status.

Bullying can be:

- physical – eg, hitting or taking / damaging someone's property
- verbal – saying, writing or posting nasty things, name calling, threats
- social – spreading rumours, sharing offensive pictures or videos, excluding someone from a group.

At Tokomairiro High School we want to take on the task of eliminating all bullying from our school. We want Tokomairiro High School to be a bully-free environment. We want our school to be a place where all students feel welcome, accepted and comfortable regardless of their background, their race, their gender, their sexual orientation, their beliefs or their social standing. All students and Tokomairiro High School should feel cared for and respected.

National Bullying Prevention week culminates on Friday with Pink Shirt Day. Friday will be a mufti day and students are encouraged to support the bullying prevention initiative by wearing pink. There will be a prize for the form class who manages to wear the most pink.

Leckie Cup - 80 Years

The Leckie Cup for golf was first presented by Jim (JG) and Mill Leckie in 1936.

Milton Primary School



Over two days all of the school's four whanau groups went on trips. Two whanau groups went to the Sinclair Wetlands and two went to the Otago Museum. At the Otago Museum we learned about the Maori culture and the tools that they used and what the old instruments looked like. One of the instruments was a piece of wood tied to a string. You wound up the string and spun it around in a circle. There was a big waka which is like a kayak. They had knives made out of whale bone and in the tikis there were people holding lizards which was a sign of death. There were some wooden axes and woven clothes. We put some gloves on and got to hold some instruments and some chisels made of rock and greenstone. One instrument looked like a recorder but instead of blowing into it you blew across the top of it.

The other two whanau groups visited the Sinclair Wetlands. This was an important part of the concept we are investigating this term which is "Environment and Sustainability". Our first activity was to watch a video about the wetlands and we learnt about some of the creatures that live there. We went on a walk around part of the wetlands and our guide, Glenn, talked to us about interesting things we found along the way. We all enjoyed the wonderful view from the lookout and it was fascinating to find out about the type of pests that invade the wetlands and how they trap them. After lunch, we spent some time planting some native plants to help develop the wetlands. It was a very enjoyable and interesting day.



Break-Away Holiday Programme

Tokomairiro Waiora were very fortunate this year to continue receiving funding from MSD to hold a holiday programme for youth aged 11-17 years in the first week of the April school holidays. Our objective was to encourage youth to "Know your own strengths and skills" This year we decided to divide the children into three even teams because we all know that we all have different strengths and skills, so by working as a team you will succeed. We incorporated team building activities and learning to communicate, leadership, problem solving and listening skills. The programme ran for 20 hours spread over three days.
