North Western Australia Adventure

Waihola Clarendon WI met in the Waihola Community Hall in May. Waihola District School has been adopted as our special project this year and members have started the reading programme on Tuesdays at the School. The National Executive have designated May, South Pacific Fund Month and asked that Institutes support this initiative for funding school and women's health projects in Vanuatu and Fiji. A donation has been sent to National Federation.

Our speaker, Pauline Bacon, took members along a journey of 2269km through North Western Australia. Our adventure with Pauline commenced in Darwin. The impact of WWII bombing of the city and destruction by Cyclone Tracy meant that Darwin had been destroyed twice. The first part of the journey took us to the Kakadu National Park - which has a uranium mine within its boundaries. The first day was a long bus trip of 600km, but the destination made it worthwhile - sightings of interesting rock formations, tree growth and a lucky viewing of a sea eagle. Rock art, the area for colour preparation and images of daily life gave insight into ancient aboriginal culture. The second part of the adventure was the Kimberley tour, starting with a visit to the large Adelaide River War Cemetery and then on to the Katherine River. The journey took us further west from the Northern Territory into Western Australia. Crossing the border meant being sprayed for fruit fly and a careful check for any cane toads trying to smuggle themselves to the west. The next stop was Lake Argyle - created by the construction of the Ord River Dam. A flight to the Bungle Bungles followed, with its strange rock formations, and then the impact of irrigation and the development of sandlewood production. The Argyle diamond mine is also in this region - famous for its pink diamonds. But the flora and fauna were of more interest to Pauline; boab trees, the



brogla birds, (left) termite mounds and archer fish all were fascinating. This extraordinary journey ended in Broome.

You may have seen the documentary on the television last week regarding the Dunedin Study – the study of 1032 babies born in Dunedin between April 1972 and March 1973.

One of the most interesting questions of the study was what is it that makes someone successful in life? Intelligence was previously thought by many to be an indicator of a

successful life. The study found that after measuring a characteristic in four year olds, thirty years later it accurately predicted the income and job status of the same children when they were grown up. That measure was SELF CONTROL. The Dunedin Study found that anyone, no matter what age, can learn better self-control. Modelling good self-control to our children is especially important.

Year 12 and 13 Geography Camp

Our senior geography students are off to Tautuku camp this week where they will complete the practical work for their Level 2 and 3 geography standards. We wish them all the best for the camp and hope that the weather holds for them.

Otago Netball Championships

Milton Ladies' Probus Club

At the June meeting, chaired by Elsie Keast, a difficult decision was made for the club to go into recess due to not being able to fill positions on committee. Agreement has been reached with the Men's group (now known as the Milton REBUS Club) for the ladies to join them at their meetings on the third Tuesday of each month at 10am in the RSA hall. The guest speaker was Grant Craig, the operations manager for Dunedin Railways. Grant is President of FRONZ (Federation of Rail Organisations of New Zealand) which covers small rail and tram operators throughout the country. He showed slides to illustrate the preservation journey for local enthusiasts, starting with the Ocean Beach Railway in 1963. Gradual development culminated in what is now the Taieri Gorge Railway. This services average 80 cruise ships per season with around 450 to 500 people on each trip. 20 carriages are towed by three 900HP locomotives.

The train is also used for weddings, centennials and the annual Cadbury Crunchie excursion. Approximately 80,000 to 90,000 passengers ride the train each year, with the profit going back into the business. There are both paid staff and volunteers.

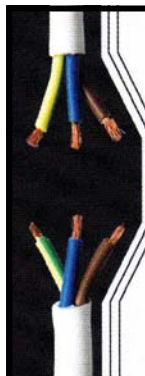
