Changes to the running of the Tokomairiro High School Homework and Tutoring Centre

Starting from next term a re-jig of the homework centre is planned, with the aim of encouraging more students to use this great resource. The homework centre is in the library and students therefore have access to all its resources including computers. Mr Daniels is on hand and, along with assistance, provides hot chocolate and biscuits

From the first day back in Term 3, there will be a duty roster from Monday - Thursday where at least four seniors will be in attendance from 3.15-4.15. These students will remain there, doing their own homework, and/or assisting with tutoring. Providing these students attend regularly they will earn a Tutoring Club badge by the end of term.

Note the centre is open to anyone to attend at any time. Class teachers may also write a note in a student's logbook from time to time to encourage attendance. Parents and caregivers may at any time also request attendance. Please either use the logbook or leave a message at the school office.


Students who have been tutored previously may still attend but will not be necessarily guaranteed the same tutor each time.

As this starts in Term 3, we would particularly like to encourage attendance from older students in order for them to get some homework and study done. If students have work or sport, and need to leave before 4.15, it is still okay to attend the centre in the time available to them.

In order to make this revamp successful and establish an atmosphere suitable for learning, all students are expected to comply with the school code of conduct - respect,

responsibility and excellence.

This facility started as a department of Tokomairiro High School 25 years ago for forestry training and has been extended over time for youth who need an alternative to school based learning. They are expected to gain a qualification at NCEA level 1 or 2. The programme has grown to include three components: 14 – 16 year olds, 16 – 17 year olds and adult training. Funding is provided by the Tertiary Training Commission and set requirements are expected to be met. Students come from Balclutha, Mosgiel and Milton. The main component is forestry/carpentry with retail/hospitality also studied. There are three full time, two part time staff and two teacher aides available. All staff members have National teaching qualifications. Linda answered questions put to her and was thanked by Noel and presented with a gift. The funding is provided in four stages, with the next round closing 26 August 2016.

CRITERIA FOR APPROVED PROJECTS INCLUDE:

- Providing opportunities to engage with and increase participation in local arts activities, e.g. choir performances
- Supporting the diverse artistic traditions of our local communities, eg. workshops in Maori language
- Enabling young people (under 18 years) to engage with, and participate in the arts, e.g. creating a street art project.

Some of the local groups that have previously received funding include: Lawrence Scottish Country Dance, Lawrence Photography Workshops, South Otago Theatrical Society, Balclutha Pipe Band.


