FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Tena koutou katoa

We are now into week five of term three. Welcome back to our year 10 students from their camp at Tautuku last week. It sounds like it was a lot of fun and students enjoyed the challenges. I would also like to thank the parents who attended as parent help, and acknowledge and thank the teachers who gave up their family life for three nights to be at the camp. I know the students certainly appreciate what you all do.

Class Act

Last Thursday I had the privilege of attending the Otago Daily Times Class Act awards ceremony at the Art Gallery in Dunedin. Class Act has been awarded every year since 2000. Each school in Otago can select two Class Act recipients. These are young people who show a commitment to what they do and a real potential to succeed. The Tokomairiro High School recipients for 2016 are Kane Bassett and Matthew Roxburgh. These are two young men who are committed to being the best they can be. They are two young people who set goals and strive to achieve them. ERO Review

Resilience

This week's assembly message focused on building resilience. Resilience is the ability to keep going and not give up, even under pressure – it is an important characteristic to develop. It means "bouncing back" from difficult experiences. Nelson Mandela once said: "The greatest glory in living, lies not in never falling, but in rising every time we fall." We know that often our greatest learning is when things 'go wrong'. Those are also the times when we need to call on all our inner strength to get back up and start again! In our school and home lives, developing high levels of resilience helps us to manage difficult situations effectively and cope with change.

Another definition of resilience said this: Resilience is the ability to work at optimum performance no matter what is going on around us. i.e. It is the capacity we have to face difficult situations and to manage change in a positive manner. There are some things that help us build our resilience. In my readings I have found three things which very much influence our well-being and ability to develop our resilience: Healthy diet; exercise and fresh air; adequate sleep.

These are all things we can control - I encourage you all to work hard on these and on developing your resilience.

Link benefit (benefit-based applications).

Have a joint family income that would entitle you to receive a Community Services Card (income-based applications).

Be a fee-payer with two or more children who are candidates, irrespective of family income (multiple candidate applications), where the total fees you would have to pay would otherwise be more than the \$200 multiple candidate maximum.

You cannot claim financial assistance for international fee-paying students.

How Much Will I Need To Pay

If you qualify for financial assistance and have **one** child who is a candidate, you will pay **\$20.00**.

If you qualify for financial assistance and have **two or more** children who are candidates, you will pay a maximum of **\$30.00** per family.

How Do I Apply For Financial Assistance

Complete an application form (available from the school office) and return it along with your money to the Tokomairiro High School office.


