# The Rev'd Vivienne Galletly Retires

"Who is Vivienne, who is she?" There is more to the Vivienne than we know and so this farewell message is about who Vivienne really is and what she has done with her life.

She arrived in Milton on January 27 1998 to become the Vicar of Milton-Tuapeka and this unique person soon made herself known not just to her own parishioners, both here and in Lawrence, but to all the people in Milton. She has always been there for anyone in need, the lonely, the sick, the depressed, the dying, the grieving, those without food in their homes and those in dysfunctional relationships but she has also shared our joys and our laughter. Sadly her last service will be on Jan 29 at 9.00am.

She has done more than people realise. To list some of her activities in Milton: She has served the Food Bank ever since she arrived, has been a Budget Advisor for 12½ years and spent a year on the Governance Board for Clutha Budget Advisory Service. She taught Bible in Schools in Lawrence Area School, Milton Primary School and Tokoiti School. For 13 years she ran holiday programmes for children at the Tokomairiro Co-operating Parish Church Hall and, with the help of her parishioners, wore off their energy in the gym and filled their minds with interesting things to do. She has judged Primary and Secondary speech competitions and conducted mock interviews for the National Bank at the High School; in short, she has involved herself in many school activities. She has taken Rest Home Services ever since she came, has been a member of Rotary for 18 years and been President for one and was awarded a Paul Harris Fellowship. She is also a member of BPW, now TWIG, and the Lovells Flat WI. That is just Milton and at the moment she is keeping a pastoral eye on the TP60 archaeological dig at the old Anglican cemetery. It isn't often that such opportunities arise and it is being done with reverence and already beginning to reveal ancestors from the past. Nor have our Maori brothers and sisters been forgotten as for 14 years Vivienne has been a foundation member of Nga Whanau o Tokomairiro and has sometimes acted as secretary. She was also on the Board of the Tokomairiro Youth Workers Trust and Secretary for 12 years. This is the Vivienne Milton knows, the lady in the many coloured coat who wanders around the streets of Milton in all weathers with plastic bags of food for those who have none and solace for those who need it.

But there is another Vivienne. Vivienne was born in Gore in 1946. She was educated in Gore then Port Molyneux before going on to South Otago High School. From there she moved to Otago University and gained a BSc, Hons before going to Christchurch Teacher Training College. Her teaching took her to Gore High School, Erskine College of the Sacred

Heart, Wellington and then to Northern Southland College, Lumsden. In her sermons we have heard many tales of her times at these schools.

Brought up in an Anglican home, she kept her faith and somewhere along the way she gained a Bachelor of Theology. In 1989 she was a Lay Minister in Waimea Plains. She became a Deacon in January 1995 and in September of the same year she was ordained as a priest in St Paul's Cathedral. In January 1998 she arrived in Milton, her first solo parish where she has proved to be more than an excellent vicar. To Vivienne people matter.

Did it stop there? No. Now we step into other levels few of us know about, for Vivienne is a modest person. The Diocese saw her worth, not only has she a degree in Theology but she has a very astute mind. She has been on the Board of Governors for Selwyn College, has been a member of the Diocesan's Finance and Administration committee which she chaired for four years, is a Bishop's Chaplain for Ordained Ministry and is the Dunedin Diocese director for Cusillo.

This is just a brief synopsis of a very special lady's work, work done without boastfulness or pride. The work of a very intelligent woman with two feet on the ground and yet to us in Milton she is just Vivienne, someone who drops in, helps to peel the 'spuds,' listens and gives advice if asked. She is always there and we are going to miss her. At her induction one of the hymns she chose was:

*"Brother, sister let me serve you. Let me be as Christ to you."* She has done that and more and we are proud of her. We wish her a long and happy retirement but can Vivienne retire? *Glen Taylor*

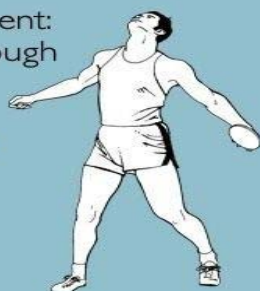

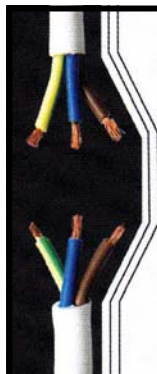
