Milton Pottery - Rebus Club

President Noel Aitken welcomed members to the April meeting and inducted the ladies to the combined club.

A DVD was shown, compiled locally by Paul Griffin and Wayne Sellwood, which has put on record the beginning and subsequent history of pottery making in Milton. Milton had one of the first and well known potteries in New Zealand, bringing potters from Staffordshire in England to produce a wide range of products, using the high quality clay available from various sites around the district. People around the world now have Milton ceramic pieces in their collections, as they are much sought after.

A wide range of pieces were produced from fancy decorative ware to domestic table ware and latterly, field tiles and insulators, some of which are still in use today. Sadly, like many of the local industries, the pottery did not remain financially viable and ultimately closed, but thanks to Paul and Wayne, its history will not be forgotten. After the DVD was shown, both Paul and Wayne explained their roles in its development and answered questions from members.

The DVD and a book compiled by Paul are on sale at the local museum with all profits going back to the museum itself.

Paul and Wayne were thanked by Keith Hopkins and given a small gift in appreciation.

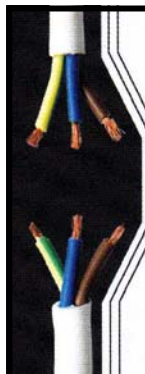
