## School Lockdown

Earlier this term the Police asked us to go into a lockdown due to an incident down the main street. When a school is put in lockdown, the students stay or go to their classroom with a teacher and the doors are locked behind them. The key thing during a lockdown is for all people to be quiet, still and out of sight as much as possible.

If a lockdown occurs in the future, parents will receive a text and/or an email saying that we are in lockdown. We would ask you not to come to the school to see if your child is alright. The reason for this is for everyone's safety. The Police will advise us when the lockdown can be lifted and we will text and/or email parents to advise them.

During a lockdown the office is locked up and staff are keeping out of sight. Our priority is the safety of the students.

## Visitors to the School

We would like to remind our community that all visitors to the school must sign in at the office. When you sign-in you will receive a visitor's badge to be worn while you are at school. This does not apply if you are attending a school event such as parent interviews or school assemblies.

## Restorative Practice Message

The Restorative Practice model has four underlying principles: Positive interpersonal relationships are a major influence on behaviour.

A culture of care supports the mana of all individuals in the school community.

Cultural responsiveness is key to creating learning communities of mutual respect and inclusion.

A restorative approach leads to individuals taking responsibility for their behaviour.

At Tokomairiro High School we focus on building positive relationships as we believe positive interpersonal relationships are a major influence on behaviour.

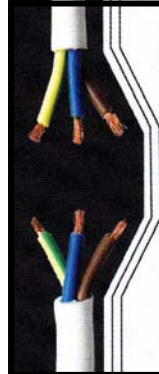
