St John Service Awards

On the 24th of June Milton St John held their annual service Awards Night. On this particularly chilly night, members and invited guests enjoyed a lovely meal before being quite moved and inspired by guest speaker Jo Heslop, a mother and author who lives on a Waitahuna farm with her husband Ben and two boys. Jo was inspired by the difficulties experienced raising a child with special needs and wrote her book entitled, "It's OK".

The formal part of the evening saw Knight of St John, Daryl Robinson and Commander of St John, Helen Griffin bestow service medals and certificates on St John members who have achieved particular milestones in years of St John service to our community. Daryl congratulated recipients for their dedication. He also remarked that the service medal which is awarded for 12 years of service has two unusual features. It is the only medal which retains the effigy of Queen Victoria (whose charter of 1888 established the Order as a Royal Order of Chivalry) and which faces to the right as opposed to all other medals of her reign which faced to the left. For each additional five years service a bar is awarded.

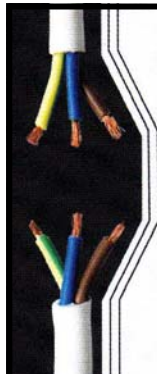
