Attendance

Attendance is an important part of schooling. Research shows there is a very strong connection between levels of attendance and achievement levels. We have a goal of 90% attendance across all levels of the school although I really believe that is not high enough and we should be aiming for at least 95% attendance.

During term two our average attendance level across all the students in the school was 88% - below our target. However, 67% of all students had at least 90% attendance, 44% at least 95% and we had 39 (15%) students who had at least 99% attendance. 27 students of those had 100% attendance.

Epro8 Challenge

On Tuesday the 1st of August, I went to Rosebank School in Balclutha for EPro8, E stands for Engineer, Pro for Problem Solving and 8 for innovate.

When I first walked in I felt nervous but in the end it was fun and I really enjoyed it. We started with a trolley of equipment and materials we needed. We had four buttons switches, four wheels, 50 wires, one light, one magnifying glass, a remote control box, two motors and 20 poles. We had two and a half hours to complete as many activities as we could. In one activity for part one we had to make a light that touched the roof by building a structure. In 1998 Merle's husband was pipe major of the Dunedin Pipe Band – her two sons were also in the Band, so when they were invited to play at Edinburgh Castle, Merle was included with responsibility for the younger members. Following a very long journey to Scotland the members of the Band found themselves accommodated in military barracks – sergeants' quarters for the women and the privates' dormitory for the men. After rehearsing for a day and a half and an early evening meal, they were collected by coach (having waited to have the coaches checked for bombs) and taken to the Castle. Another two days of rehearsing and they were ready for the spectacle – for three weeks a performance every day, two on Saturdays and on Sunday they performed at a variety of other venues. Merle was very impressed with the organization and had a tremendous amount of fun, so was delighted to be included again when the Band was invited back in 2003.

In 2007 she again travelled with a pipe band, this time her husband had joined the Christchurch Touring Band and they were hosted at the Military Base in Uxbridge and performed at Windsor. A horse show during the day and bands playing at night resulted in some interesting marching for players with manure on their boots! But for Merle a moment to be close to Her Majesty.

More recently she was off to Basel and a really hot Swiss summer. This time with the Temuka Band. Hosted in an elegant hotel, but meals in the barracks. Full dress uniform in the heat was dreadful. 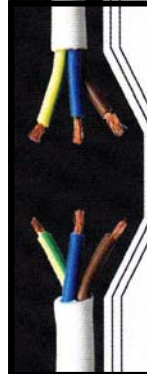
