It is important they keep asking questions and talking with their teachers if they have not yet decided on their options.

We wish our senior netball team and senior boys' hockey team all the best for their tournaments this week. The hockey team is in Oamaru and the netball team is in Christchurch. We know they will all work hard and represent our school well.

Senior Exams

The senior examinations begin on Wednesday 13 September. It is important our students work hard in preparation for these examinations. They are a great practice run and the feedback will be extremely beneficial for the students, as they identify their strengths and also the gaps in their learning, before their final NCEA examinations in November. I encourage all students to make the most of the extra tutorials being run by teachers within the school.

Kids Vote

This Friday is Election Day for our Kids Vote programme. All our students get to vote as though it was the real elections. It is a great opportunity for the students to learn about the election process. They will be able to compare their results with those of the New Zealand elections.

Internet Safety

It has been brought to my notice that a number of our students are accessing inappropriate websites. Our school WiFi system is monitored through N4L, a national educational filtering system that

blocks inappropriate sites. However, we cannot manage the sites young people access on their phones through their own data. I encourage all parents to make themselves aware of the sites their young people are accessing.

Today, it is reported that at least 90 percent of kids between the ages of 8 and 16 have watched pornography online at least once. Not only have most tweens and teens seen porn, but boys ages 12 to 17 are actually the largest consumers of online pornography. The amount of kids accessing porn truly is alarming. In fact, the statistics keep rising every single year. Right now, statistics are showing that kids first gain exposure to pornography at the age of 11.

NZQA FEES

All NZQA fees need to be paid to the school office by this **Friday 8th September 2017**. The fee is **\$76.70** unless you qualify for financial assistance as explained below.

Financial Assistance

Who can apply for financial assistance?

Financial assistance is available to assist with the payment of entry fees for National Secondary Schools qualifications. To be eligible to apply you must be the fee-payer and meet at least one of the following criteria:

Be receiving a Work and Income or Study Link benefit (benefit-based applications).

Have a joint family income that would entitle you to receive a Community Services Card (income-based applications).

Be a fee-payer with two or more children who are candidates, irrespective of family income (multiple candidate applications), where the total fees you would have to pay would otherwise be more than the \$200 multiple candidate maximum.

You cannot claim financial assistance for international fee-paying students.

How Much Will I Need To Pay

If you qualify for financial assistance and have **one** child who is a candidate, you will pay **\$20.00**.

If you qualify for financial assistance and have **two or more** children who are candidates, you will pay a maximum of **\$30.00** per family.

How Do I Apply For Financial Assistance

Complete an application form (available from the school office) and return it along with your money to the Tokomairiro High School office.

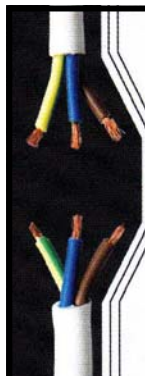
