Devotional Meetings for Milton

We are all lucky to live in Milton, and to have the wonderful Tokomairiro Community Hub, on the corner of Union and Shakespeare Streets for our use. Last June the Department of Internal Affairs employed a community development worker to help us all build community relationships and connections, to help us all find ways to make our area – Milton – even better, and to identify our own vision of a resilient community. Then to support us to put into action sustainable solutions to achieving our vision.

We all want the best for our families and ourselves and a supportive, friendly, and positive community is part of that. While we may see the negative within our community many of us do not know how to change the overall problems, they are too widespread or too out of our reach. One way we can make grassroots changes is to focus upon the positive.

Every weekday morning for the next two weeks (Wednesday 18th until Wednesday 2nd) and then one day a week after that a devotional meeting will be held at the Tokomairiro Hub from 7.30am until 8.00am for anyone to drop in to say prayers or discuss the spiritual dimension of human existence. No specific religion will be promoted, they will just be a way for us to infuse our community with positivity and higher thoughts for our collective endeavours regardless of religion, faith or creed. The meetings will be fostered by the local Baha'i community. Baha'i devotional gatherings welcome everyone. Anyone who comes is welcome to bring their own prayers or readings. Baha'u'llah, the prophet and founder of the Baha'i Faith, taught the oneness of God and the essential unity of all religions, so Baha'is consider all people as one human family. For Baha'is, regular prayer and meditation light each person's soul, and fuel everyone's inner spiritual life. Devotional meetings take place in homes, parks, libraries, community rooms, houses of worship or outside in nature; and they can happen when two people or a thousand people gather to worship.

So, we would love to see you at the Hub any morning over the next two weeks. Drop in.
