Noel Aitken welcomed members to the meeting in the absence of the President and Vice President.

Annie Soper from O'Malley & Co talked about Wills and Powers of Attorney. Annie is a local, having grown up in Milton, gone to school here, and then returned after going to university. She explained that Powers of Attorney are a good thing to discuss with family. If these are not in place should they be needed if the person is overseas, or in case of incapacity, then the court will make decisions (at a cost!). There are two types – a straight Power of Attorney useful while the person is travelling or an Enduring Power of Attorney in case the person is unable to make decisions themselves.

Wills are important too, so the distribution of a person's estate is in accordance with their wishes. Things to remember are: Keep checking your will every now and then to ensure it is up-to-date with your current wishes. Are the executors still alive, are the gifts still relevant and are there issues where challenges could be made? Even promises made verbally and not followed through with can be challenged. Specific advice was to 1. Choose more than one executor (family, friend or professional person). 2. Label individual items for people as well as listing them as reference. 3. Talk with family about wishes for burial, cremation etc. 4. With the residue of the estate either state set amounts or proportion. Lawyers can assist with administering an estate. Probate is needed for land (not if jointly owned) or more than \$15,000 in one bank account. Trusts are now under scrutiny to ensure the correct legal procedures are adhered to. Executors of a will must follow the terms of the will and in the case of minors inheriting, be seen to invest wisely and use discretion to distribute money from the estate.

Members were keen to ask questions and found Annie helpful with her responses. She was thanked by Len Murdoch and presented with a basket of fruit.

Break-Away Programme

Tokomairiro Waiora were once again fortunate to receiving funding from MSD to hold a holiday programme for youth aged 11-17 years in the first week of the April school holidays, from 16th – 18th April. The objective of the programme was to have fun and to encourage the participants to 'build their confidence while working alongside each other in teams'.

Day two was Dunedin Training Centre, Escape Room (left) and Tenpin Bowling, followed by a well-earned treat. It is great to be back from my trip overseas where I met international student agents, and prospective students and parents. I was thrilled to be able to share the wonderful things that have been happening at our school this year. There certainly appeared to be a much more positive view of attending small schools rather than the larger city schools with large groups of other internationals. I had the opportunity to catch up with Emanuel Rodriguez and his mum, Ines, both of whom were wonderful ambassadors for our school. I also had the opportunity to meet Robert Schloemann's mum; another pleasure on my part.

Cross Country

What a fabulous afternoon we had last Wednesday when the school cross country competition was held in brilliant sunshine. It was great to see the students out running the course and supporting each other. There were some outstanding performances, with the most exciting finish being in the Minor Boys competition – Johnny Fegan and Wyatt Mallon sprinting together for the finish line. The other races were not quite so close with our top athletes easily winning their divisions.

Results for House Points: 1st Ayson - 250 points, 2nd Ross - 212 points, 3rd Reid - 180 points, 4th Malcolm - 175 points. Congratulations to Ayson; the reason they did so well was because all their seniors turned up and ran in the event, most coming in the first six places.

Teen Ag

I would like to add my congratulations to the Teen Ag group who did so well at the Otago Southland competition and who are now busy funding raising for their trip to the national championships later in the year.

Attendance Term 1

In assembly on Monday we celebrated those students who had achieved 100% attendance during term 1. 38 students managed to attend school every day during the first term – a fantastic effort. We have a school target of at least 90% attendance across all year levels. During term 1, 66% of our year 7 to 11 students attended at least 90% of the time – a very good effort. Unfortunately, our year 12 and 13 students have let us down with only 38% reaching the 90% attendance threshold. Attendance at school is critical if students are to achieve to their potential across all their learning areas. I encourage the senior students to commit to being in school every lesson, every day

and really focus on achieving to their very best this year.

East Otago Exchange

This is on Tuesday this week. Five girls and five boys from each year level compete in four different sports at the Edgar Centre. Congratulations to all those students selected to represent Tokomairiro High School. I know our students will play fair and play hard, and represent the school well.

Bully-free Week in New Zealand –

Bully-free week is May 14-18, 2018. 87% of students feel safe at school all or most of the time (*Census@School 2015*), BUT, amongst 15 year olds, NZ has the second highest rate of bullying out of 51 countries – survey results in an international study in NZ in 2015 indicated that just over a quarter of the students taking part in the survey reported being subject to some type of bullying at least a few times a month. Verbal abuse is the biggest bullying problem in schools and cyber bullying has been on the increase over the past few years. Bullying happens at every school. It takes many forms - physical, verbal and social - and it can happen in person, online and even via text message. Studies show children and young people who are bullied are more likely to be depressed, lonely or anxious; to have low self-esteem and to struggle academically; dislike school and miss classes; distrust peers and have problems making friends; and experience declined mental and emotional health. Schools that encourage respect, value opinions, celebrate difference, and promote positive relationships make it difficult for bullying behaviour to thrive or be tolerated. To achieve this, it needs everyone – school staff, students, trustees, parents, whānau and communities – talking about the issue and working together. Let's make sure bullying is not part of the culture in our school; let's not tolerate bullying in our environment.

Friday 18 May. Pink Shirt Day aims to create schools, workplaces and communities where all people feel safe, valued and respected.


