



New Project Brings Community Together



An exciting new project is underway - the Tokomairiro Community Garden is on the horizon. The co-ordinators are currently sourcing a piece of land that can be used for the long term foreseeable future. Their vision is that the garden will become a place to grow organic healthy food, grown without

harmful sprays using various organic principles incorporating Hua Parakore and biodynamics. This food will not only be shared with the community gardeners and their whanau but also shared with the Tokomairiro Community Hub as a koha for members of the community. The team are able to offer various workshops to its' members including compost making, worm farming, propagation, crop rotation, medicinal herbs, healthy beauty products, preservation of kai and lunar planting for example.

Also available is a Kai Oranga (Healthy Food) Programme – a Level 3 course complete with 120 credits - with classes to cater for everyone both during the day and in the evening – shift workers can also be catered for.

This is a wonderful opportunity for the Milton Community. The long term vision is for local schools, early childhood centres, youth groups, community groups to all have their own patch in the gardens, educating each other, with garden co-ordinators available for education sessions and workshops on a regular basis.

Whether you are seeking skills for your own garden and family, looking to help out with a worthwhile project, participate in workshops, gain a qualification that could be the start of your career or just to make new friends, we have something to offer everyone.

The group are holding an information evening on Thursday 7th June at 7pm at Tokomairiro High School in Te Whare – just follow the signs. Supper is also provided and a chance to chat informally with the co-ordinators.

Waihola-Clarendon WI

Waihola-Clarendon WI's special project for May was in support of the National South Pacific Fund. Age Concern's Debbie George was our speaker. Debbie is their executive officer and came to them after working with vulnerable infants – her journey has been from one end of the age spectrum to the other. Although her topic was Elder Abuse, the background to the extensive work done by Age Concern Otago surprised most of us – undertaken by thirteen paid employees and over one thousand volunteers! Their mission: to ensure wellbeing, dignity and health services for older people. Debbie gave examples of the range of activities that Age Concern is involved with and rightly says we in Otago should be proud of them. Their services include: Meals on Wheels, An accredited visiting service to combat loneliness and isolation, Response to elder neglect and abuse, Education.

We learnt that one in ten older people are affected by abuse, often this is financial abuse by family members with addictions; self-neglect and hoarding in squalor mean that a lot of Age Concern's work is related to these issues. But, more positively were the range of education programmes such as *Senior Chef* - focused on cooking for the older person, *Steady As You Go* falls prevention programmes (of concern that ACC funding has been withdrawn), *English for Seniors* – targeting a variety of ethnic groups, *Life Without a Car*, the ukelele choir and *Senior Citizen Clubs* amongst many opportunities available.

Future directions include work with the DHB as community health care moves from hospitals to hubs. IT support will be increasingly important to enable older people to access health records. The DCC does not have a commitment to the WHO age friendly standards; however, Age Concern is initiating an assessment of the city and would hope to see these adopted.

Dunedin City does not fund a generic social worker and the volunteer programmes help fill this gap. Debbie's final message was that the volunteers gain as much if not more from their work as the people they support – combating loneliness and providing a sense of purpose.
