We are also on the lookout for 5mm crochet hooks, pins with coloured-ball heads, containers for sewing materials and any other equipment that may contribute to the workshop. The intention of Project Bruce is to foster learning and social connections in a fun environment! And it will be fun! ## Message from Mr King

Throughout the year in assemblies, I have talked to the students about the need to "Turn up, try hard and follow the Tokomairiro Way." This simple mantra is designed to help the students understand the importance of self-management. In surveys conducted with businesses, self-management is one of the most consistently important things that employers look for. The three keys for self-management are **initiative, organisation and accountability**.

The question some of our students ask is "how do I show these skills?"

There are lots of ways to improve your initiative and accountability at school, and to get organised too.

You can show initiative by starting a project or activity on your own. For example, blood drive.

\*You can volunteer for charity events and come up with great ideas to make them even more successful.

\*If you're doing a group project, as well as building your teamwork skills you can learn from someone else and contribute your own ideas so you both grow.

\*Volunteering at a charity or buddy reading every week shows initiative and also proves you understand the value of service to others.

\*Getting homework out of the way will leave you stress-free and with more free time on your hands - which you can enjoy without the shadow of homework hanging over you.

\*As an organised person you will keep your timetable secure so you can attend classes on time.

\*Making lists and study notes in advance can help you keep to a revision schedule and have enough time to revise trickier subjects.

\*Being able to break big chunks of revision into smaller bite-sized pieces will help you revise in a more productive way and feel like you're in charge of your destiny during exams.

Building self-management skills at school will help you:

\*Prepare for big events like exams (preparation usually means less stress).

\*Help you get a better balance of work, study and relaxation.

\*Help you get more out of your school experience by volunteering ideas and time.

At Tokomairiro High School we want all our students to leave us with the capabilities to be good employees and make positive contributions to society. It has been a privilege in my time at the school to work with many of our senior students on planning their next steps after school. It has been really interesting to see the diverse pathways that our students take.

One thing is always clear; when a student has a clear goal their motivation is higher. However, as a student at the same age I told myself that I would never be a teacher. So it is OK

not to know what you want to do. Many of our students find themselves in this situation. By completing at least NCEA level 2 or by gaining University Entrance through NCEA level 3, students can keep their options open. I would encourage all our senior students to come along to the careers evening on

## Persuasive Writing - Dogs

An injury may not show up immediately, but tell your Doctor what has happened. Cathy had some pamphlets to give out, which are very interesting reading. Cathy was thanked by Olive and given a fruit basket.
